

# SAYS DR. EINSTEIN WILL GO TO MADRID

Spanish Minister Announces  
Physicist Has Accepted  
Professorship There.

NEWS RECEIVED WITH JOY

Scientist Sure to Come to America  
In Fall for Princeton Post, Dr.  
Abraham Flexner Says.

MADRID, April 10.—Professor Albert Einstein [who refuses to return to his home in Germany because of anti-Semitism] has accepted the chair of Research Professor of Science at Madrid University, it was officially announced today by the Minister of Public Instruction, Fernando de Los Rios.

The Minister said the offer had been made officially by the Spanish State. This is interpreted generally to mean that the nation which excluded Jews in 1492 after a campaign more stringent than that in Germany today has officially recognized its mistake after 441 years.

**Many Express Joy.**

Officials, academic circles and the press express joy over Professor Einstein's acceptance. The newspaper *Heraldo de Madrid* refers to a recent speech of Premier Azana in which he declared:

"Spain's greatest contribution to the world has been cultural. When we speak of making Spain greater under a republic we mean we wish to return to a Spanish State with a creative force, which, for reasons that I shall not mention, we have lost."

Señor de Los Rios said:

"I have received an urgent radio message in which Professor Einstein accepts the offer made to him by the Spanish State to occupy a chair in the university here, where he will continue his scientific studies.

"The Spanish university has obtained an intellectual force which will help to raise the level of Spanish science. This is a seal of honor for Spain and the university."

The expressed object of the Spanish Republic is to make possible national renaissance, and official circles are far from adverse to admitting Jews who would stimulate commerce here.

**Expected in America in Fall.**

Professor Einstein is certain to begin service Oct. 1 as a member of the faculty of the School of Mathematics of the new Institute for Advanced Study, which will have temporary headquarters in Fine Hall, Princeton University, it was said yesterday at the office of Dr. Abraham Flexner, director of the institute.

Dr. Einstein is to be Professor of Mathematical Physics at the institute. The announcement of his acceptance was made last October.
